The Night is Far Spent, The Day is At Hand

The night is usually a time for sleeping and inactivity but day time is a time for activity and work. Night time is also associated with the evil works of darkness. "And that, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep: for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed." (Romans 13:11)

Do we know the time? Sometimes people have an appointment which they end up missing because they fail to check the time. This occurs as they think they have plenty of time; they take it easy - only to realise that time has ran out on them.

There have been times when I have casually glanced at the clock without focussing and then potter around the house, thinking I had plenty of time before I needed to leave. The realisation of having misread the time brought on shock and a period of hurried activity. I suddenly realised it was much later than I thought and was in danger of missing an important appointment. I am sure we can all relate to this scenario. Sometimes, people may read the clock correctly but the clock they are using is not showing the right time. The battery may be low or at other times the clock should have gone forward or backwards by an hour - e.g. for British Summer time.

Satan, our arch enemy will tell us not to worry because we have plenty of time. He'll say: "You don't have to get serious for God now as you're still young. You have your whole life ahead of you. One day, when you're older you can dedicate your life to God." With Satan it is always tomorrow; but tomorrow never comes.

We need to realise that Satan is a liar and the father of liars (cited from St. John 8:55). He does not mean us any good. The things he promises us do not even belong to him. He simply uses them to tempt and bribe us. Once he gets us in his grasp he then takes away everything he gave us and offers them to someone else. I remember as a teenager whilst still at school, always thinking I would give my heart to God one day, but not now. I felt that I wanted to enjoy my life first, until one Sunday night God spoke to me in a church meeting through a lady who was a new convert. I'll never forget her words: "Young man, young man, you want to go to heaven but you're bound for hell."

God loved me so much that He sent someone to warn me of my impending destruction if I did not change my ways. "And this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come." (St. Matthew 24:14)

Some people take comfort in the fact that the Church is not established in all the world and so they believe the end is not yet. God said He would do a quick work. Sometimes people have been caught off guard because things happened so quickly and there was no time for them to make corrections. The people of Pompeii were buried alive when Mount Vesuvius suddenly erupted in AD 79. Everything was buried in time just as the larva of the eruption caught them.

Paul's encouragement to the members in Rome was: "The night is far spent, the day is at hand: let us therefore cast off the works of darkness and let us put on the armour of light." (Romans 13:12)

If we are going to make it to heaven we must live holy lives. The definition of Holiness as stated in 'We Hold These Truths' (29 Prominent Teachings of The Church of God) says: "Holiness is the state of being free from sin, a condition made possible by the experience of Sanctification. God requires man to live sinless in this present world and provides the means through the shed blood of Christ." The words from a well known song by Charles W. Naylor says:

Heaven is a holy place, Filled with glory and with grace – Sin can never enter there; All within its gates are pure, From defilement kept secure – Sin can never enter there.

Chorus:

Sin can never enter there, Sin can never enter there; So if at the judgment bar Sinful spots your soul shall mar, You can never enter there.

If you hope to dwell at last, When your life on earth is past, In that home so bright and fair, You must here be cleansed from sin, Have the life of Christ within – Sin can never enter there.

"put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil."


(Ephesians 6:11)

The general Women's Missionary Band theme for the assembly year 2012-2013 is:

'LIFT UP YOUR EYES AND LOOK' on the fields for they are white already to harvest

Jesus found it necessary to go through Samaria on His journey from Judea to Galilee. However, by the time He arrived in Samaria, the journey had left Him and His disciples tired and hungry. The disciples went off to get physical food but Jesus' necessity to go through Samaria was a spiritual one, a spiritual hunger. Some of us may be familiar with the account of Jesus' encounter with the woman at the well.

When the disciples returned with physical food, they prompted Jesus to eat. The Lord replied: "...I have meat to eat that ye know not of." (St. John 4:32)

We can find it easy to be preoccupied with the needs of the moment (the physical needs), but in this statement Jesus invites us to get beyond our own needs/interests and open our eyes to the souls of men who are searching for answers to their deepest needs. Jesus "...must needs go through Samaria" (verse 4) because someone needed the spiritual food He had to give.

Although He had physical needs, the spiritual needs of a soul took precedence. It had become necessary to leave the literal food and pursue the spiritual meat. His meat was to finish the work His Father had sent Him to do.


As missionaries, we need to leave our physical food from time to time and hunger spiritually for souls: "Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? Behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest." (St. John 4:35)

Yes, we may be thinking there is time to look after my physical food (look after myself and my family) and we are consumed with this, but Jesus said "...*Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields,*" they are ripe now. Do not wait for the appointed time (set time that we choose). We need to be spontaneous; our meat is to do the will of Him who has called us now! It is time to give up some of the 'me time' for Christ.

It was a great time of fellowship and a lovely way to enter into our morning worship. Everyone was catered for and there was even food that was left over.


