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England's First Men's Retreat

It was a memorable day as the brothers of The Church of God in England gathered for their first National Men's Retreat on Friday 5th June 2015. For many years this had been spoken about, but eventually Brother Justin Clarke took up the mantle to organise the event. The theme of the Retreat was 'To be a Man of God' taken from James 5:10. As the day approached, the men were excited about the prospect of gathering to seek the Lord and fellowshipping together.

After a hearty meal following our arrival at the Whitemoor Lakes Activity Centre, we had some introductory words from our National Overseer after which he led a concert prayer for the success of the event.

Brother George Wilson conducted a wonderful devotion based on the life of David, king of Israel who was described as a man after God's own heart.

He spoke about the way that David gained his experience looking after his father's sheep and was later anointed and called of God. We were encouraged to be like David.

Brother Jerome Solomon did an excellent presentation entitled 'What it means to be a Man of God.'

On Saturday morning at breakfast time in the canteen nearly everyone went up for seconds. That tells us something about the quality of the food.

After breakfast, Brother Patrick Clarke led the devotion, looking at the life of Samson. As a Nazarite he had to live a consecrated life to have the favour of God. He was greatly used of God to accomplish many great feats but had his weaknesses which his enemies exploited.

During our sports session we had a game of indoor cricket. In a tight game, Brother Stuart Brown bowled out Brother Patrick to give his side a win by 5 runs.

In the afternoon we had superb presentations from Brother Jason Prince and Brother Rikki Prince. Brother Jason looked at 'The preparation for Marriage and what came next.' Both the married and single brothers were asked to draw up a list. Brother Rikki looked at 'Conflict and Conflict Resolution.' There was much discussion on both of these topics.

For the evening session, Brother Joshua Anderson did an outstanding devotion which was followed by a presentation by Brother Stuart Brown looking at some of the areas that the enemy uses to attack men. He mentioned that the biggest problem comes from 'self' and that the solution was to develop a personal relationship with God and to mortify the flesh.

On Sunday morning, Brother James Mwila led the devotion - based on the character of Job. He said that in order to test Job, Satan had to first get permission from God. After Job received the news of all the disasters, he worshipped God and did not charge Him foolishly. Job's hope was not in his earthly, material possessions. He was anchored in God.

We then had an open air Sunday School class by the lakeside which reminded us of Jesus teaching by the Sea of Galilee. It was no coincidence that the day's lesson was based on 'The Christian Man.'

In our final session we were asked to write down a problem in our lives. We then prayed for each other and specifically for individuals who requested special prayers.

All too soon the National Men's Retreat came to an end, but we all felt that we were leaving with a special blessing.

Sadly, after we dismissed and sat around talking, we heard of the tragic death of our General Overseer, Bishop Stephen E. Smith. For about ten minutes we sat in total disbelief. We know without a shadow of a doubt that he has gone on to his eternal reward.

Let's continue to pray for Sister Smith and the Smith family for continued strength.



This is that...Guide

One of the roles of the Holy Ghost is to guide us into all truth. Have you ever felt the Lord directing you? Have you ever been obedient and seen the reason as to why the Lord was directing you that way? What a blessing it is. St. John 16:13 reads: "Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come."

Isn't that amazing? To know whatever the Holy Ghost hears, that's what He will show us, including things in the future. The Scripture says *all truth*. We know that Jesus Christ is the way, truth, and the life (St. John 14:6). The Holy Ghost can guide a person into the revelation and truth of Jesus Christ. A guide that the Holy Ghost can use is us as people. After all, we are just vessels waiting to be used. Do we have this prayer in our hearts and in our mouths - here am I send me (Isaiah 6:8)?

Sometimes, we may feel that God does not talk to us directly concerning witnessing to someone. Do we always have to hear the words "Go and speak to that person about their soul?" The answer is no - (also not forgetting the Great Commission given to all of us by Jesus Himself in St. Matthew 28:19).

Let us look at the Scripture with Jesus and the woman at the well (St. John 4:7-39). Many people believed on Christ because of a conversation that started with Jesus saying "give me to drink" in verse 7. From this simple question, much was spoken about which led to not just her believing in Christ but also many that came to see a Man (St. John 4:29 and verse 39).

This is not the account that I would like to focus on. I want to use Philip as his call will be very familiar to many. Acts 8:26-29:

"And the angel of the Lord spake unto Philip, saying, Arise, and go toward the south unto the way that goeth down from Jerusalem unto Gaza, which is desert. And he arose and went: and, behold, a man of Ethiopia, an eunuch of great authority under Candace queen of the Ethiopians, who had the charge of all her treasure, and had come to Jerusalem for to worship, Was returning, and sitting in his chariot read Esaias the prophet. Then the Spirit said unto Philip, Go near, and join thyself to this chariot."

The part I would like to focus on is verse 29: "Then the Spirit said unto Philip, Go near, and join thyself to this chariot." Go join thyself to this chariot. No mention of who is in there, no mention of what he is to do when he gets there, no mention of speaking to someone about their soul, or Jesus Christ in verses 30-31:

"And Philip ran thither to him, and heard him read the prophet Esaias, and said, Understandest thou what thou readest? And he said, How can I, except some man should guide me? And he desired Philip that he would come up and sit with him."

There was something hot inside Philip's bones at the sound of someone reading the Holy Scriptures. We can maybe begin to know how he felt if we think of how we feel when we hear someone mention Jesus, or how we would feel if we saw someone reading the Bible near to us. It sets something off inside of us, AMEN! Philip wanted to go further, maybe the plan of why the Spirit spake to him in the first place was beginning to unfold in front of his eyes. This all started from Philip being obedient to join himself to the chariot.

We may have heard these words "go and speak to that person" or "go and help that person with their shopping", or even "give that person 10p to pay the rest of their grocery bill". In whatever way God speaks to us, we should be obedient as we never know the reason why. It could be to the saving of a soul, it could be to show the light of Christ, it could be to share the truth with a person that is already a Christian. The understanding of what Philip was teaching about Christ led the Eunuch to be baptized in Acts 8:36-39. Who knows where our conversations may lead a soul: to Christ, to be baptized, to The Church of God. In whatever way He leads, we can be assured that the Holy Ghost is never wrong as He only speaks of what He hears. We can also be assured that the Holy Ghost will guide all that are obedient to Him into ALL TRUTH.

National Ladies Retreat

Our National Ladies Retreat took place at The Holiday Inn, Great Barr, Birmingham on 23rd to 24th May 2015. The theme was 'Let me be a beacon and an overcomer.'

Sister Cynthia Opoku preached the first message on Saturday morning. We were asked – "do you want to be a beacon?" The word beacon was defined and Sister Cynthia spoke about beacons on top of police cars and ambulances. They are positioned in a focal point and attract attention. Sister Cynthia stated that our lives should be like magnets to attract the world. People are watching us as children of God. Galatians 5:16-24 was read concerning the works of the flesh and the fruit of the Spirit.

Sister Cynthia said those who have not accepted Christ do not war against the flesh as they are fleshy. Christians have this fight and are engaged in spiritual warfare. When we overcome the flesh, we will become beacons. Without the fruit of the Spirit, we cannot be beacons.

Sister Jennifer Thompson led the afternoon devotion. The sisters sang 'Let my life be a light' whilst a wonderful visual demonstration was shown. The lighting was switched off and a flashlight beamed effectively in the darkened room. Sister Jennifer stated a lighthouse is a beacon and stands as a guide. Our lives should illuminate and attract others to Jesus. Like a lighthouse, we are here to warn men of the dangers of not accepting Christ. St. Matthew 5:14-16.

A presentation followed from Sister Claudine Brown on the theme topic, with the focus on being an overcomer. The definition of an overcomer was given and it was stated that a lot of our overcoming is done in the mind.

The life of the Bible character Joshua was studied and we were reminded of his overcoming spirit. Numbers 13:31-33. Numbers 14:6-9, 30. There were 12 spies sent on a mission, but 2 had a totally different perspective to the 10 who were the majority. Caleb and Joshua's faith shaped their mentality. Deuteronomy 31:23 Joshua believed in God's promise. Joshua 3:7-8, Joshua 4:6, 21-24, Joshua 10:7-8, 24. We were asked how can we as Sister "Joshuaettes" overcome in our lives? The sisters concluded to maintain a positive mentality and to trust in God. His promise is great to him that overcometh in Revelation 3:21.

Sister Oneaka Prince led the next devotion. The Scriptures used for this were 1 Thessalonians 5:4-11 and Romans 12:21. We were encouraged to be lights, to shine in our environments and to overcome evil with good. The Spirit of God was present.

Pastor Angela Clarke did a presentation on the life of the Apostle Simon Peter. We explored his background, history and a fisherman's characteristics. Sister Angela said God can use and change anyone for His purpose and cause.

Jesus chose these types of people who maybe the world would shun. Our personal testimonies can help someone else. St. Mark 3:17 - Peter forsook all to follow Jesus. We are called to do something on God's programme. The Spirit of God manifested Himself and took over. A Holy Ghost message and interpretation was given to the congregation.

Our National Ladies Retreat Co-ordinator, Pastor Beverley Anderson preached the closing message on the theme. Sister Beverley stated that a beacon is an encourager, an example who out shines others and is a guiding light. An overcomer is a conqueror who triumphs.

In Genesis 1:31, God created everything and it was very good. Enoch was the first beacon in the Bible. Genesis 5:22 shows how he walked with God. As long as God is our Companion and Guide, we will triumph. Enoch pleased God. Hebrews 11:5.

Noah in Genesis 6:22 was a beacon. For us today to be beacons, we must do all that God has commanded us.

Sarah, wife of Abraham was the first God fearing woman recorded in the holy Bible. In comparison with Abraham, Sarah's faith was less. In the Scriptures, there are also examples of women with no holiness, piety or godliness. In Genesis 4:19 we learn of Eve's grand-daughters – Zillah and Adah. They were both involved in a polygamous marriage with one man, Lamech. The definition of both names was given – Adah meaning 'adorning the outward man' and Zillah means 'jewellery'. Genesis 3:16 documents where God said Eve's desire was to be to her husband and he was to rule over her. Adah and Zillah tried to change this. Pastor Anderson went on to state that our Advice to Members advises us what the Scriptures say regarding adornment and dress. There is no place in The Church of God for the spirit of Adah and Zillah.

Esau's two Canaanite wives – Judith the daughter of Beeri and Bashemath the daughter of Elon the Hittite were 'a grief of mind unto Isaac and to Rebekah' (Genesis 26:34-35). Esau's light had gone out and he was no more a beacon. The Canaanite lifestyle was more appealing to him.

Pastor Anderson concluded by declaring these women were no shining examples. We are losing our older generation of warriors in Christ one by one. It is our responsibility to live as beacons. It is high time that we put Him first.

Soon after this, our National Ladies Retreat for 2015 came to a close. We thank the Lord for encouraging and admonishing us through His Word to be living beacons for Him.



England's 61st Annual National Convention


