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Thy Faith Hath Made Thee Whole

The sacrifice of Christ provided not only for the salvation of men's souls, but also for the healing of our physical ailments. Divine healing is healing accomplished by the power of God and is available to all who believe, the same as salvation.

"Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." (Hebrews 11:1)

"But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him." (Hebrews 11:6)

Faith is the key that opens the door: "And a certain woman, which had an issue of blood twelve years, And had suffered many things of many physicians, and had spent all that she had, and was nothing bettered, but rather grew worse." (St. Mark 5:25-26)

Having this problem meant that this woman could not fully participate in certain activities and mingle with those around her: "And if a woman have an issue, and her issue in her flesh be blood, she shall be put apart seven days: and whosoever toucheth her shall be unclean until the even.

And every thing that she lieth upon in her separation shall be unclean: every thing also that she sitteth upon shall be unclean. And whosoever toucheth her bed shall wash his clothes, and bathe himself in water, and be unclean until the even. And whosoever toucheth any thing that she sat upon shall wash his clothes, and bathe himself in water, and be unclean until the even. And if it be on her bed, or on any thing whereon she sitteth, when he toucheth it, he shall be unclean until the even. And if any man lie with her at all, and her flowers be upon him, he shall be unclean seven days; and all the bed whereon he lieth shall be unclean."

(Leviticus 15:19-24)

This Scripture speaks about a woman having a temporary issue of blood. It goes on to describe how anyone touching her or anything she came into contact with would likewise be unclean until the evening. Also, anyone laying with her would be unclean for seven days.

The scenario for a woman having this ailment continually is further addressed in the chapter:

"And if a woman have an issue of her blood many days out of the time of her separation,

or if it run beyond the time of her separation; all the days of the issue of her uncleanness shall be as the days of her separation: she shall be unclean. Every bed whereon she lieth all the days of her issue shall be unto her as the bed of her separation: and whatsoever she sitteth upon shall be unclean, as the uncleanness separation. And whosoever toucheth those things shall be unclean, and shall wash his clothes, and bathe himself in water, and be unclean until the even. But if she be cleansed of her issue, then she shall number to herself seven days, and after that she shall be clean. And on the eighth day she shall take unto her two turtles, or two young pigeons, and bring them unto the priest, to the door of the tabernacle of the congregation. priest shall offer the one for a sin offering, and the other for a burnt offering; and the priest shall make an atonement for her before the LORD for the issue of her uncleanness." (Leviticus 15:25-30)

The woman in St. Mark 5:25-26 had suffered with this same situation for twelve continuous years. Her life must have been a living nightmare, constantly longing to be normal like those around her. Possibly, she was married. She may have had children, but she could not come into contact with them. **Jesus was her last resort.**

If we are going to receive our healing, Jesus must be our last resort. If we have contingency measures we are planning to take if we are not healed, then we will not be healed. IT MUST BE GOD OR GOD!

There were a lot of people around Jesus and many touched His clothes. Some even touched his body but nothing happened to them: "When she had heard of Jesus, came in the press behind, and touched his garment. For she said, If I may touch but his clothes, I shall be whole. And straightway the fountain of her blood was dried up; and she felt in her body that she was healed of that plague.

And Jesus, immediately knowing in himself that virtue had gone out of him, turned him about in the press, and said, Who touched my clothes? And his disciples said unto him, Thou seest the multitude thronging thee, and sayest thou, Who touched me? And he looked round about to see her that had done this thing. But the woman fearing and trembling, knowing what was done in her, came and fell down before him, and told him all the truth. And he said unto her, Daughter, thy faith hath made thee whole; go in peace, and be whole of thy plague." (St. Mark 5:27-34)

This woman had tried all the known sources of help but was still the same. **SHE WAS NOW DESPERATE.** If we are going to receive anything from God, we must become desperate.

Healing is not just a conditioning of the mind but must also be a conditioning of the heart. "…and I will cause him to draw near, and he shall approach unto me: for who is this that engaged his heart to approach unto me? saith the Lord." (Jeremiah 30:21)

To *engage* in this sense is to be interlocked, committed or connected. God has to draw us in order for us to approach unto Him but we must first engage our hearts. Her heart was interlocked with Jesus and so as He moved, He drew her along.

Some people are not healed because of sin in their life or un-confessed sins of the past. **TIME DOES NOT HEAL SIN.** Sins unconfessed are sins un-forgiven. Likewise, God is not going to heal us and give us a healthy body to continue sinning. We have to make Him some promises first: "Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much." (James 5:16)

The new general Women's Missionary Band theme for the assembly year 2013-2014 is:

'Faithfulness of the Women's Missionary Band; Past, Present and Future'

(Ecclesiastes 9:10)

As members of The Church of God, let us be faithful to the cause of Christ, as we embark on another year of service.

Let us be encouraged by the Apostle Paul - one of the most faithful missionaries of the grace dispensation. He was a great leader and encourager.

The Apostle Paul was an encouragement to missionaries:

He made three major missionary journeys that Luke covers between chapters 13 and 28 of Acts. (Missionaries read these books for encouragement).

The Apostle Paul became the first itinerant preacher (in other words, a travelling preacher).

He wrote more books of the New Testament than any other early Church leader, (although Luke's two books may contain as many words as Paul's).

Twelve of the twenty-eight books are his epistles, and they are the foundation of most traditional, mainstream Christian theological study. They address specific problems that congregations faced then and now.

Paul constantly encouraged the faithful saints - as an example, his encouragement to the saints at Colosse:

"For this cause we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you, and to desire that ye might be filled with the knowledge of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God; Strengthened with all might, according to his glorious power, unto all patience and longsuffering with joyfulness; Giving thanks unto the Father, which hath made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light: Who hath delivered us from the power of darkness, and hath translated us into the kingdom of his dear Son: In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins."

(Colossians 1:9-14)

I am using the same encouragement to encourage us to remain faithful as the Apostle Paul did from Colossians 1:10: "That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God."

Also, in Ephesians 1:15-18, the Apostle Paul states: "Wherefore I also, after I heard of your faith in the Lord Jesus, and love unto all the saints, Cease not to give thanks for you, making mention of you in my prayers; That the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give unto you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of him: The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints."

National Sunday School Challenge
