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A Glorious Church

On visiting the General Assembly in August 2010, I was made more aware of the fact that The Church of God is well on her way to perfection. God is breaking down all the barriers. There was such love and unity amongst those in attendance.

There was no difference between black and white or Spanish and English for examples. There was a humility in her leadership which is akin to that shown by Jesus, the lowly Nazarene who had nowhere to lay His head.

When introducing feet washing to the early Church Jesus said: *"If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet."* (St. John 13:14)

If we do not allow God to perfect us as individuals, we are going to be left behind as the Church marches on to perfection. At times we may feel that we are ok but God sees in us what we do not see in ourselves. If we will be perfect then self has to die. The Apostle Paul said "...for when I am weak, then am I strong." (2 Corinthians 12:10)

We may try to avoid the perfection process but we cannot go to heaven without being made perfect. People will say that we cannot be perfect in this world, but Jesus said: "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect." (St. Matthew 5:48)

God does not see perfection as we do. We judge one another from what we see outwardly but God sees the heart. We will be perfected through **obedience**, **humility** and **submission**. These are not terms that the world holds in high regard. Sometimes we do things ignorantly without knowing they are wrong, but once the Holy Ghost reveals to us that they are wrong we can no longer plead ignorance. If we still do the wrong God will punish us for disobedience.

A part of our covenant of membership asks if we will walk in the light to the best of our knowledge and ability, yet many members are content to stay at the salvation stage. They fail to go on to *Sanctification* and then to become baptised with the *Holy Ghost*.

Patience and practice will help to make us **perfect**. As Christians, we must be pleasant at all times. We should have a smile even when we do not feel like smiling. We have to love even the unlovable.

Sometimes it seems like we are the only ones being tried and tested, but we are all going through the perfecting process in our own ways. God knows what needs to be removed from all of us. Some people are proud so God will allow things to happen to humble them and eradicate their pride.

Sometimes God has to bring us to a crisis situation like He did with Jacob. He had been running from himself all his life, but God allowed a situation to develop where he was forced to confront himself.

Jacob had deceived his brother and tricked his father before leaving home and going away for twenty one years. In all that time he lived in Padan-aram but he had not changed. He was still the same Jacob. When it was time for him to leave, God stirred up Laban and his sons against Jacob. This culminated in him no longer feeling comfortable amongst them.

Jacob left Padan-aram to return home but knew that he had to reconcile with his brother. He had done him wrong in the past and had not seen him for all these years. "And Jacob sent messengers before him to Esau his brother unto the land of Seir, the country of Edom. And he commanded them, saying, Thus shall ye speak unto my lord Esau; Thy servant Jacob saith thus, I have sojourned with Laban, and stayed there until now: and I have oxen, and and menservants, asses, flocks, and womenservants: and I have sent to tell my lord, that I may find grace in thy sight. And the messengers returned to Jacob, saying, We came to thy brother Esau, and also he cometh to meet thee, and four hundred men with him. Then Jacob was greatly afraid and distressed: and he divided the people that was with him, and the flocks, and herds, and the camels, into two bands; and said, If Esau come to the one company, and smite it, then the other company which is left shall escape. And Jacob was left alone; and there wrestled a man with him until the breaking of the day. And when he saw that he prevailed not against him, he touched the hollow of his thigh; and the hollow of Jacob's thigh was out of joint, as he wrestled with him. And he said, Let me go, for the day breaketh. And he said, I will not let thee go, except thou bless me. And he said unto him, What is thy name?

And he said, Jacob. And he said, Thy name shall be called no more Jacob, but Israel: for as a prince hast thou power with God and with men, and hast prevailed." (Genesis 32:3-8, 24-28)

Jesus will not leave the purging and the perfecting of His Bride to anyone else. "That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish." (Ephesians 5:27)

When we have spots on our garments, we rub or dab them out to remove them as they are a blemish. When we have wrinkles, we straighten them out with a hot iron. "And it shall come to pass, that in all the land, saith the LORD, two parts therein shall be cut off and die; but the third shall be left therein. And I will bring the third part through the fire, and will refine them as silver is refined, and will try them as gold is tried: they shall call on my name, and I will hear them: I will say, It is my people: and they shall say, The LORD is my God." (Zechariah 13:8-9)

Right now God is taking the Church through the furnace. The furnace is not a pleasant place to be. It is where the impurities are removed to bring forth the finished article. "Another parable put he forth unto them, saying, The kingdom of heaven is likened unto a man which sowed good seed in his field: but while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat, and went his way. But when the blade was sprung up, and brought forth fruit, then appeared the tares also. So the servants of the householder came and said unto him, Sir, didst not thou sow good seed in thy field? from whence then hath it tares? He said unto them, An enemy hath done this. The servants said unto him, Wilt thou then that we go and gather them up? But he said, Nay; lest while ye gather up the tares, ye root up also the wheat with them. Let both grow together until the harvest: and in the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, Gather ye together first the tares, and bind them in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn." (St. Matthew 13:24-30)

Not everyone who claims to be a Christian is a true sheep. Though they may look like one and even "baa" like one, some do not have the nature of sheep. Jesus said by their fruits ye shall know them (cited from St. Matthew 7:16). Jesus also said that true sheep would hear His voice and follow Him. They would not follow the voice of a stranger (cited from St. John 10:4). Sheep are easily led, but goats are another matter. Goats are **stubborn**, **self willed** and will butt you down if you get in their way. Having goats in the midst of sheep causes problems due to their different natures.

Stubborn and **self willed** individuals in our congregations will cause problems in our churches. They do not want anyone telling them what to do. It was this mixed multitude that caused Moses all the trouble in the wilderness as he led the children of Israel to the Promised Land.

Much of our problems today are because of this ongoing struggle between **SELF WILL** and **DIVINE WILL** in The Church of God. Self will must be cast out of The Church of God in the same way that Sarah told Abraham to cast out the bond woman and her son. "...for the son of this bondwoman shall not be heir with my son, even with Isaac." (Genesis 21:10)

The last days perfected Church will not have such people in it. Some people in the Church have hidden under the radar for years. The Holy Ghost is going to do some stirring up and everything that is presently hidden will be revealed.

If we refuse to be admonished, we will eventually be rejected.

God will have a **glorious Church** not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing. \square

There are non-believers and backsliders out there who know the truth but choose not to live by it. We therefore need to develop a love and a passion for it. Then we will handle it with care and will be enthused to share it with others. Let us not misuse the truth by bragging with it or angrily shoving it at non-believers. We are instructed in God's Word to speak the truth in love (cited from Ephesians 4:15).

To echo the sentiments of our dear former General Overseer, Bishop Robert Pruitt in his article *"Buy the Truth and Sell it Not"* (The Evening Light, June 1995 issue), we must not let the truth slip through our fingers. Youth, if we get it wrong now, the generations that follow us in The Church of God will get it wrong also. Then the generation after that will live by an even more distorted version of the doctrine. We have to uphold the standard *now*.

In closing, Bishop Pruitt in the abovementioned article stated:



Home Going Celebration

The funeral service for the late Deacon Cranston Harrison took place at Trinity Methodist Church, Handsworth on Tuesday 12th October 2010. This was the same venue where he tied the knot with Armena Taylor-Harrison some four years earlier.

The building was packed to capacity as friends and family gathered to pay their last respects. The service was moderated by the National Overseer of The Church of God in England, Philip Bennett. The coffin entered the church draped in The Church of God flag under which Deacon Harrison had been a faithful member for 62 years. Deacon Harrison epitomized the scripture in 1 Corinthians 4:2 which states: *"Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful."*

It was good to see so many former members of The Church of God in attendance. Family and friends alike shared their fond memories of Deacon Harrison. His unflappable nature was nearly always mentioned.

Bishop Robert J. Hawkins, Jr. the former National Overseer and now World Missions Co-ordinator for The Church of God preached the message. Bishop Hawkins and his wife came all the way from the USA for the funeral. In his address, Bishop Hawkins made reference to the faithfulness of Deacon Harrison and threw out the challenge to the family to pick up the mantle. There was a spirit of rejoicing throughout the service which was unlike a traditional funeral as we celebrated the passing out ceremony of a great man of God. The internment took place at the cemetery in Handsworth.

It will be strange to not have Deacon Harrison around as he had been one of the foundation stones for The Church of God in England. We hope to meet him again in *"the sweet forever."* To quote a line from the popular song, *'The Christian's Goodnight*' by Sarah Doudney: **Only "Good night"**, **beloved**, **not "farewell!"...Good night! Good night! Good night!**

What's happening in **Druids Heath Church?**

On Sunday 24th October 2010 the theme for our CPMA service was The Fruit of the Spirit.

"But the fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law." (Galatians 5:22-23)

One of the CPMA leaders conducted a teaching session about the benefits of eating fruit and the nutritional values for the body. A beautiful array of fruit was displayed throughout the service. There are nine fruits of the Spirit taken from Galatians 5:22-23: *Love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness and temperance.* Nine exhortations were given, one on each fruit of the Spirit. The CPMA leader also compared a temporal piece of fruit with a fruit of the Spirit.

We learnt how well all the fruits work together to compose the fruit basket. The CPMA leader further explained that each fruit carried out a particular role and had the essential vitamins that the body needed. Eating just one piece of fruit is not as effective as eating five. The physical body requires the essential vitamins that all the fruits have when consumed together. This also helps the body to function properly.

We were encouraged to have all the fruit of the Spirit. Galatians 5:23 states "...against such there is no law." We should all possess the fruit of the Spirit in order to please God and have a good spiritual balance.
