...and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful

As we gather here today in our National Ministers' Convention, the new general WMB theme: "Arise and go...the work is not yet finished" is reminding us that we still have work to do.

Sometimes, we have little or no urgency towards the work we have been called to do. It is as if we have all the time in the world, but the work of God requires haste. We cannot put anything or anyone before Christ and His work: "And he spake many things unto them in parables, saying, Behold, a sower went forth to sow; And when he sowed, some seeds fell by the way side, and the fowls came and devoured them up: Some fell upon stony places, where they had not much earth: and forthwith they sprung up, because they had no deepness of earth: And when the sun was up, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away. And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprung up, and choked them: But other fell into good ground, and brought forth fruit, some an hundredfold, some sixtyfold, some thirtyfold. Who hath ears to hear, let him hear." (St. Matthew 13:3-9)

Jesus then went on to explain the parable to the disciples: "Hear ye therefore the parable of the sower. When any one heareth the word

of the kingdom, and understandeth it not, then cometh the wicked one, and catcheth away that which was sown in his heart. This is he which received seed by the way side. But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it; Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended. He also that received seed among the thorns is he that heareth the word; and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful. But he that received seed into the good ground is he that heareth the word, and understandeth it; which also beareth fruit, and bringeth forth, some an hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty."

(St. Matthew 13:18-23)

Today, I will be looking at "He also that received seed among the thorns." The Bible said of such a person: "...and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful."

"He which received seed by the way side" did not last long, as the experience was only superficial. There was no depth.

Likewise "he that received the seed into stony places" only "dureth for a while." The Bible does not give any indication as to the time span for the person "that received seed among the thorns" before these things became embedded. This person may have been among thorns for some time, but managed to keep on top of them by regular weeding.

This is like the person who is saved, but fails to move on to sanctification - or the person who has lost their sanctification. They treat the symptom but fail to address the root cause. It is not enough to keep cutting down the weeds. They need to be rooted up and eradicated - otherwise they are going to choke and make one unfruitful.

God knows that we have to live in this world. When we allow the cares of life and the desire for material possessions to overwhelm us to the point where they take up all our time and attention, we become unfruitful. We become good for nothing, like the salt that has lost its sayour.

The Bible has a great deal to say about the dangers of riches: "But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. And having food and raiment let us be therewith content. But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and into many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition. For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. But thou, O man of God, flee these things; and follow after righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, meekness. Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses." (1Timothy 6:6-12)

Lately, my attention has been drawn to Christ's message to the seven churches of Asia. I preached a part of this to my local church in my last message:

"Unto the angel of the church of Ephesus write; These things saith he that holdeth the seven stars in his right hand, who walketh in the midst of the seven golden candlesticks; I know thy works, and thy labour, and thy patience, and how thou canst not bear them which are evil: and thou hast tried them which say they are apostles, and are not, and hast found them liars: And hast borne, and hast patience, and for my name's sake hast laboured, and hast not fainted. Nevertheless I have somewhat against thee, because thou hast left thy first love. Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto quickly, and will remove candlestick out of his place, except thou repent. But this thou hast, that thou hatest the deeds of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate. He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the tree of life, which is in the midst of the paradise of God." (Revelation 2:1-7)

There was only one indictment against this Church, but very serious "...thou has left thy first love." Their first love was more than likely their love for Christ at their conversion. Notice, they had left their first love, not lost it - indicating that they had abandoned it, or left it behind; whether knowingly or through negligence. If love is not in a relationship it will grow stale and will not last.

When someone loses their love for God, the relationship becomes mundane to the point where one just carries on out of duty or because they took a covenant. They still do their duties, but their heart is not in it.

Are you still in love with Jesus like when you first met Him or has the relationship grown cold? Christ's encouragement to them in verse five was: "Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent."

The Pastor or the Overseer will not have to remove us. God Himself will. Over the years, I have seen people in Church who were not living right but in many instances I did not have to do anything; God did the removing.

Some of us are like the Church at Sardis. They were only living off their past reputation: "And unto the angel of the church in Sardis write; These things saith he that hath the seven Spirits of God, and the seven stars; I know thy works, that thou hast a name that thou livest, and art dead. Be watchful, and strengthen the things which remain, that are ready to die: for I have not found thy works perfect before God. Remember therefore how thou hast received and heard, and hold fast, and repent. If therefore thou shalt not watch, I will come on thee as a thief, and thou shalt not know what hour I will come upon thee. Thou hast a few names even in Sardis which have not defiled their garments; and they shall walk with me in white: for they are worthy. He that overcometh, the same shall be clothed in white raiment; and I will not blot out his name out of the book of life, but I will confess his name before my Father, and before his angels. He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches." (Revelation 3:1-6)

We need to rekindle our love and passion for Christ and the work He has called us to do. We need the Holy Ghost and fire to help us.

Every month the Pastors have to make out a report stating how many are saved, sanctified and filled with the Holy Ghost. Most of the time, this is just based on historical evidence. The fact that we were saved, sanctified and filled at one time does not mean that is the case today. In fact the evidence in some lives indicates that we need to go back to Calvary and renew our works.

Some people claim to be filled with the Holy Ghost but have not spoken in tongues or moved in the Spirit for years. We cannot do the work without the Holy Ghost and fire. As we start another Assembly year, it is worth re-emphasising that this is the

National Ministers' Convention so it is centred on ministers - whether licensed or unlicensed. However, in one sense we are all ministers and have been called to minister and to bring forth good fruit: "Ye have not chosen me, but I have chosen you, and ordained you, that ye should go and bring forth fruit, and that your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my name, he may give it you." (St. John 15:16)

Have you ever observed what use to be a fruitful branch after it has been detached from the tree for a day or two? Its appearance changes drastically. It loses its vitality.

In closing, let us look at Christ's final message to the seven churches: "And unto the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write; These things saith the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God; I know thy works, that thou art neither cold nor hot: I would thou wert cold or hot. So then because thou art lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spue thee out of my mouth. Because thou sayest, I am rich, and increased with goods, and have need of nothing; and knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked: I counsel thee to buy of me gold tried in the fire, that thou mayest be rich; and white raiment, that thou mayest be clothed, and that the shame of thy nakedness do not appear; and anoint thine eyes with eyesalve, that thou mayest see. As many as I love, I rebuke and chasten: be zealous therefore, and repent. Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me. To him that overcometh will I grant to sit with me in my throne, even as I also overcame, and am set down with my Father in his throne. He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches." (Revelation 3:14-22)

Let us be careful that "the care of the world and the deceitfulness of riches" do not choke the Word and cause us to be unfruitful.

Restore unto me the joy of thy salvation; And uphold me with thy free spirit. Then will I teach transgressors thy ways; And sinners shall be converted unto thee." (Psalm 51:10-13)

I thank God for His goodness, grace and mercy. The Lord is not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance.

All ten virgins had a plan which was to go and meet the bridegroom, but when there was a delay in meeting him, the foolish virgins were caught out. They missed their opportunity, due to lack of preparation. They had a plan but it was not good enough and too late for preparation at the final moment. On the other hand, the wise virgins had pre-prepared before they even set off to meet the bridegroom. The delay in meeting him did not affect them at all and they seized the moment.

Let us seek the Lord and allow Him to prepare us. We are on a spiritual battlefield every single day. Continue to call upon the Lord in prayer and fasting, in reading His word and be in line with him: "For the eyes of the Lord are over the righteous, and his ears are open unto their prayers…" (1 Peter 3:12).

1 Peter 3:15 also encourages us to prepare and be ready: "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear:" There are souls out there searching for righteousness, hope and Jesus. We as workers need to be ready to tell them of the hope we have and lead them to Christ. God bless you all and have a blessed 2018. "Be Prepared."


SUNDAY SCHOOL BOOST


Sunday School Department Announcements:

The Church of God (England) National Ministers' Convention

National Ministers' Convention convened on 11th November 2017 and the theme was 'And because iniquity shall abound; the love of many shall wax cold' (St. Matthew 24:12).

Sister Wilhelmina Brown gave the ABM boost and introduced the new general theme 'All Things Common'. The National Family Camp boost followed. The date for Camp 2018 will be 2nd - 5th April 2018. Fund raising initiatives were announced for this endeavour: a National Family Camp concert, Carol Singing in December 2017 and a Sponsored Walk, scheduled for February 2018.

We were blessed with special singing by Sister Bria Anderson and Sister Zhane Stirling. They sang 'You made a way' and God was in this song.

Pastor Beverley Anderson boosted the Women's Missionary Band auxiliary. The new general WMB theme for 2017-2018 is 'Arise and Go...the work is not yet finished'. Pastor Anderson encouraged the Church to keep Dorcas Club alive and displayed waist coats made by Handsworth's Dorcas Club. Activities for the department this Assembly year will be National Ladies Retreat on 19th-20th May 2018, National WMB Fasting on 17th March 2018 and a national WMB revival. Pastor Anderson proceeded to encourage the congregation from St. Matthew 24:12 stating, we fight the enemy on our knees and when the flesh is weak, the Holy Ghost empowers us.

The CPMA/BTI boosts were given by Brother Stuart Brown. The continuing general BTI theme is 'Into His Presence'. A song was played: 'Who shall be able to Stand?' and a Scripture reading from Psalm 24:3-4 given. Brother Stuart thanked God for the Church being able to complete 1st Term of BTI in 2017 and announced plans for 2nd Term in 2018. The new general CMPA theme for 2017-2018 is 'Identity'. Handsworth and London churches were congratulated for achieving 100% in their CPMA memberships and Emergency Dollar offerings. As an incentive, the General CPMA Co-ordinator - Bishop James Horne will award certificates to churches that are 100% in CPMA membership.

Bishop Bennett gave his annual address entitled "...and the care of this world, and the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful" (St. Matthew 13:3-9, 18-23). Bishop Bennett stated seeds planted by the wayside do not last long - note the Bible does not give a time scale. Root up the weeds and thorns. Eradicate them, otherwise they will choke us. He said it is the cares of this world and deceitfulness of riches that makes us unfruitful. It was stressed material possessions cannot satisfy. The analogy of a pregnant woman carrying her child in the womb was used in referring to the Holy Ghost. At times the mother feels the child moving inside of her. The question was posed "so how can we say we have the Holy Ghost and not feel anything?" (1 Timothy 6:10-11, Revelation 2:1-7, Revelation 3:1-6, 14-22).

Sister Claudine Brown encouraged the VLBs with St. Mark 6:35-44 to be anointed by God. The new general theme is 'Anointed to Serve'. She stated as anointed servants, we need to meet the needs of others.

Brother Justin Clarke boosted the National Men's Retreat and gave the date for next retreat: 15th - 17th June 2018. The Evangelism Boost followed by Brother James Mwila. The new general theme for the Assembly year is 'Evangelism from the Inside Out' (Psalm 51:10-13). He set out some of his plans for the year, which included visiting residential homes and hoping to gain access into prisons to teach and encourage prisoners.

Sister Jennifer Thompson boosted the Sunday School department. The continuing general theme is 'Embrace the Vision'. Sister Jennifer spoke of the initiative given from Sister Marlowe, the General Sunday School Co-ordinator. This encourages local Schools to forge connections with other Sunday Schools around the world, with the aim of sharing knowledge of how we teach and learn the Word. Planned events for the department were a Family Fun Day on 2ndth June 2018 and Vacation Bible School.

The final message of the day was preached by Brother Justin Clarke, entitled 'But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved' (St. Matthew 24:13). Brother Justin used Job's trials as an example to endure to the end of our Christian journey. He declared we are all one Body and have a responsibility to each other. We should live in the spirit of meekness (Galatians 6:1). He stressed, if we are to endure to the end, we need to be resilient. It may mean we have to repent and this is okay if we desire to be saved (Psalm 51:1-13).

The Convention concluded as we sang 'Create in me a clean heart' and the altar was filled with brethren and visitors. Appreciation was given to all who worked during the Convention and we were dismissed with the benediction.


District Meeting

The Church of God in England held District Meeting again, after a number of years at Long Lane Church, Birmingham. The revival of the District Meeting was welcomed by the presence of the Lord as we sang 'Someday, I'll go where Jesus is'. Bishop Bennett, the moderator welcomed the congregation and our visitors from The Church of God in Alabama, USA - Brother and Sister Deitz. Bishop Bennett read Isaiah 41:8-15.

We were encouraged by testimonies from Brother Rikki Prince and Sister Deitz. This was followed by special singing from the National Choir. They sang 'I never lost my praise' and 'You are worthy'.

Brother Deitz then delivered a thought provoking message based around the theme of 'Love' and 'Loving God right'.

The following is an adaptation of Sister Claudine Brown's testimony which she shared about his message. "The basis of the message was 'Love'. Psalm 133:1.




We thank God for what He has given us in 2017 and for the blessing that awaits us in 2018.

wonderful spirit that day.





Saturday 17th February 2018 was the final fund raiser for the Assembly year
