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"...Why stand ye here all the day idle?"

Jesus, during His earthly ministry emphasized the urgency of the harvest. "Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest." (St. John 4:35)

The devil will try to convince us that we have plenty of time, but souls are passing every day without God. The words of a song says, *"How can I be at ease while they're dying, and are passing every day without God?"* On average, 150,000 people (souls) pass from this world every day into eternity. If they were not saved, they have gone on to hell.

Every so often this number includes someone who was very close to us and then the reality hits us; but after a while we return to our slumber. This was not so with Jesus. "³⁶But when he saw the multitudes, he was moved with compassion on them, because they fainted, and were scattered abroad, as sheep having no shepherd. ³⁷Then saith he unto his disciples, The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few; ³⁸Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest." (St. Matthew 9:36-38)

Jesus was moved with compassion and if we are to be effective, we too must be moved with compassion for those who are lost. **Compassion:** A feeling of distress and pity for the suffering or misfortune for another, often including the desire to alleviate it. To suffer with.

In the cycle of sowing, growing and reaping (harvest), the harvest period is the shortest period. If the harvest is not gathered in speedily, it will be destroyed. It can be destroyed by the weather or other enemies to the crop - such as pests and birds. Satan, our arch enemy is working overtime to destroy the harvest. He uses various tactics like sickness, disease and war and is destroying priceless souls by the millions. In the book of Revelation, Chapter 5 we read about the four horsemen of the apocalypse.

- We determine that the rider on the white horse represents Christ and the spreading of the gospel. (Revelation 6:1-2)
- The rider on the red horse represents war and has the power to take peace from the earth; resulting in the death of countless souls. (Revelation 6:3-4)
- The black horse represents famine which also has killed and is still killing millions world-wide. (Revelation 6:5-6)
- The rider of the pale horse is Death and represents disease and pestilences etc. Hell followed with him; so as Death killed them they were cast into hell. (Revelation 7:7-8)

As the earth's population increases, there is a greater need for more labourers. **Labourer:** *A person involved in physical work especially of an unskilled type.*

As previously stated, Satan will tell us that we have plenty of time and as we relax, he is busy sending millions to hell. Jesus, while on the earth was consumed with compassion for the harvest of the souls of men. He did not have time to waste. On one occasion He said: "I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work." (St. John 9:4)

While passing through Samaria on one occasion His disciples left Him to go and buy food. Jesus used the opportunity to minister to a woman who was a lost soul (St. John 4). We need to be busy gathering the harvest, but so many are idling their time away with things that do not profit:

"1For the kingdom of heaven is like unto a man that is an householder, which went out early in the morning to hire labourers into his vineyard. ²And when he had agreed with the labourers for a penny a day, he sent them into his vineyard. ³And he went out about the third hour, and others standing idle in saw the marketplace, ⁴And said unto them; Go ye also into the vineyard, and whatsoever is right I will give you. And they went their way. ⁵Again he went out about the sixth and ninth hour, and did likewise. 6And about the eleventh hour he went out, and found others standing idle, and saith unto them, Why stand ye here all the day idle? ⁷They say unto him, Because no man hath hired us. He saith unto them, Go ye also into the vineyard; and whatsoever is right, that shall ye receive." (St. Matthew 20: 1-7) Third hour - 9:00 am Sixth hour – 12 noon Ninth hour - 3:00 pm Eleventh hour - 5:00 pm: just before the night and darkness was to fall.

The householder was eager to gather the harvest and went out at various times during the day, as there was still work to be done - even at the eleventh hour. Each time he went out, he found others who were standing idle and called them to his vineyard to work. He did not want the harvest to be ruined. Likewise, Jesus is calling for labourers today. Sometimes, I do not think we really have a true revelation of hell and its finality.

An extract from our Twenty-Nine Prominent Teachings states: *"The unconverted and the wicked are doomed to eternal punishment, from which there is no escape – no liberation or annihilation."* Jesus gave us an account of the awfulness of hell. Some refer to this as a parable, but this was not a parable. Jesus even referred to one of the individuals by name: "19There was a certain rich man, which was clothed in and fine linen, and fared purple sumptuously every day: ²⁰And there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, which was laid at his gate, full of sores, ²¹And desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table: moreover the dogs came and licked his sores. ²²And it came to pass, that the beggar died, and was carried by the angels into Abraham's bosom: the rich man also died, and was buried; ²³And in hell he lift up his eyes, being in torments, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom. ²⁴And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; for I am tormented in this flame. ²⁵But Abraham said, Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime receivedst thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented. ²⁶And beside all this, between us and you there is a great gulf fixed: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that would come from thence. ²⁷Then he said, I pray thee therefore, father, that thou wouldest send him to my father's house: ²⁸For I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment. ²⁹Abraham saith unto him, They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them. ³⁰And he said, Nay, father Abraham: but if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent. ³¹And he said unto him, If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead. (St. Luke 16:19-31)

Hell is real. Let us do all that we can, while we can that we might by all means save some from going there.

This is a Ministers' Convention and the ministry have to be examples in gathering the harvest. No minister should have nil reports month after month - e.g. Tracts distributed – Nil New home prayer meetings – Nil Number saved – Nil Number sanctified – Nil

Homes visited - Nil

We need to be seeking out opportunities to have new home prayer meetings and carry tracts around with us to give out to the unsaved. Being in the ministry is not just having a title; we have been called to work as labourers together with God: "11And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; ¹²For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: ¹³Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:" (Ephesians 4:11-13)

The Evangelist is supposed to go out and win the lost. Then the Teacher teaches them and the Pastor is responsible for keeping them. So often, the poor Pastors or one or two others have to do it all, as the members relax. This has a knock-on effect on the work. We all have a responsibility to gather in the harvest.

At this late hour we cannot be idle when everything around us is pointing to the imminent return of our Lord."¹⁸And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. ¹⁹Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: ²⁰Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen." (St. Matthew 28:18-20)

The Great Commission was given to the Church. We do not need a license to witness to the lost. As well as telling them about what God did for Peter and Paul, we can tell them about what God has done for us. The call of God is the greatest call any person can have upon their lives. If God has called you to work for Him don't stoop to be a king. Use the talents that God has given you.

In closing, let me quote the words of this beautiful song by Daniel March:

Hark, the voice of Jesus calling, "Who will go and work today? Fields are ripe and harvests waiting; Who will bear the sheaves away?"

Loud and long the Master calleth; rich reward he offers thee. Who will answer, gladly saying, "Here am I, send me, send me"? If you cannot sing like angels, If you cannot preach like Paul, You can tell the love of Jesus, You can say He died for all.

If you cannot give your thousand, You can give the widow's mite, And the least you do for Jesus, Will be precious in His sight.

Let none hear you idly saying, "There is nothing I can do;" While the souls of men are dying, And the Master calls for you.

Take the task He gives you gladly, Let His work your pleasure be. Answer quickly when He calleth. "Hear am I send me, send me."



The Church of God (England) National Ministers' Convention Saturday 5th November 2022

The Church of God (England) met at Long Lane Church, Halesowen for the annual National Ministers' Convention. The day was filled with messages that focused on the theme '*Why stand ye here all the day idle?*' The National auxiliary co-ordinators outlined plans for the assembly year 2022-2023 and encouraged each member to participate in activities planned throughout the year.

The National Overseer, Bishop Bennett's address was based on the convention theme '*Why stand ye here all the day idle?*' (St. Matthew 20:6). In this parable, Jesus spoke of a householder who needed labourers for his vineyard. The householder went out early in the morning and agreed to pay a penny a day to those labourers that he found. He did the same again on the third, and sixth hour and agreed to pay whatsoever is right. At the eleventh hour, the householder found men 'standing all the day idle'. Their excuse was 'because no man had hath hired us.'

In **St. John 4:31-35**; Jesus spoke of the harvest, but He was speaking of the spiritual harvest of souls. Jesus knew the time was short and wanted His disciples to see that it was reaping time. People needed to hear the truth. Today, many souls are dying without Christ. We should be concerned like Jesus was for these souls. **St. Matthew 9:36-38**; Jesus was moved with compassion, 'the harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few'. Farmers know that harvesting time is very important. They only have a very short time before their crops are destroyed by rodents, pestilence or the weather. Satan is working overtime to destroy the spiritual harvest and has no compassion because he cannot love. He wants souls to be destroyed by sickness, disease and wars.

The thief - who is Satan, comes only to steal, kill and destroy, **St. John 10:10**. We can all be guilty of wasting time, but a labourer will be busy doing whatever needs to be done. If we knew we only had 24 hours to live, every second would be valuable. Time is a precious commodity. Once it is spent, it cannot be regained. Time is getting shorter and many souls are dying daily - without hope. We can never know who is willing to listen or will give their heart to God. We should not be concerned about a person's looks or reputation but must use godly wisdom and let all know about Christ and His saving grace.

The householder was eager for his harvest to be gathered, but many stood by, idly. Jesus is looking for labourers today. There is no time to stand idle, as everyone has an opportunity to work in their own vicinity. **St Matthew 28:18-20**; 'go ye therefore and teach all nations...' when God has called us to work for Him, it is an honour. Jesus is coming soon. Let us not be idle but be busy in God's service.

Sister Dawn Prince delivered a message entitled: 'I must work the works of him that sent me, while it is day...' St. John 9:4. Work takes effort and sacrifice, but what we put in is what we will get out. Work can become tiresome, but when we work for God, He gives us the strength we need Isaiah 40:29. Jesus is the light of the world and had a limited time on earth to accomplish His Father's work. St. Luke 19:10 states Jesus came to seek and to save the lost. Jesus worked while it was day because He knew His night was coming. We too must focus our work during our day-time, as there will come a time when we cannot work. Time is limited. 1 Corinthians 3:13 encourages us not to waste time, for our work will be tried and the result of our work will be manifested. In the days of Nehemiah 'the people had a mind to work', Nehemiah 4:6. They were able by the grace of God to rebuild the wall of Jerusalem in 52 days. With God's leading, we can do amazing things, we will not get weary and the work will be done. Let us be steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, 1 Corinthians 15:58, for we will receive a reward if we serve the Lord Christ, Colossians 3:24.

May the grace of God help us not to be idle as we endeavour to preach, teach and baptise in His name.
