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National Overseer's Address to Ministers' Convention, 2nd November 2024

As we gather here today in our National Ministers' Convention, we have a year of labour ahead of us. Our mandate is the Great Commission, which was given to us by Jesus Christ Himself.

We are pleased to see the start of the new mission in Walsall, and pray that God will bless and prosper it in every way. Please continue to pray for Brother Justin Clarke, Sister Chedene Clarke and all who will be assisting the work.

Many of us were privileged to attend the last General Assembly, and to visit the site for our new Assembly Tabernacle. The Tabernacle Advancement Committee has been entrusted with the task of raising funds for the building of the Tabernacle. This will be a mammoth task, and as such, will require us all to do our best. All the countries have been allocated a sum to collect during the year. The sum for the nation of England is \$2,500 (£1,917).

Various initiatives have been proposed, such as 10 for \$100. This is basically finding 10 people who are willing to donate \$100. There is also a 5 for \$5.00 initiative, which can be utilized by our Gleaners and younger children. We can decide on our own figures in British pounds. I will discuss this with the National Trustees. (These were later agreed as £50.00 and £5.00).

There is a form for each initiative, which I will ensure the Pastors have to distribute to the members. There is also a thank you letter that we can give to the donors. We can also let them know that their donation is tax deductible if they complete yearly tax returns, or if they are self-employed. All auxiliary co-ordinators are asked to put plans in place to raise funds to contribute to this total.

(The General Overseer outlined 10 abbreviated steps to help every participant to be successful. The full guidance can be found online on our International website or in the November 2024 edition of The Evening Light).

Step 1: Pray – Ask the Lord to help you find 10 donors (Agonize before you Organise).

Step 2: Identify your 10 – Take time to write down the names of people to talk to.

Step 3: Make contact – Visit them personally, send a text, make a phone call, etc.

Step 4: Share the Vision – Our goal is to have a home, an Assembly Tabernacle, to hold our annual meetings. This will be where we can be free to operate on our own schedule and preach the Word of God without restraint.

Step 5: Ask for a Donation – Simply ask, "Would you be willing to make a tax deductible donation of \$100 to help The Church of God build an Assembly Tabernacle?"

Step 6: Collect Contact Information – This is a crucial step and one that will help this campaign take on another level! We are asking every participant to collect the name, email, and phone number of all donors and give them to their Tabernacle Fundraising Co-ordinator or Overseer. This is important because we want to give a special thank you from the General Overseer.

Step 7: Offer an Evening Light Subscription – Simply ask, "Would you like me to sign you up for our Church paper called 'The Evening Light' so you can keep up with the progress of the Tabernacle project? It's free and will be emailed to you each month."

Step 8: Give a Donation Receipt – once a donation is received, the donor should be given a receipt for tax purposes. Until the receipt is available on the Church website, participants will be instructed to contact

Brother Montgomery, their Tabernacle Fundraising Coordinator, or their Overseer for a copy.

Step 9: Give a Creative "Thank You" – This is an opportunity for Overseers, Pastors, and local churches to be creative with public relations. For example, host a donor recognition meal. Making positive connections with family, friends, and the community is a great way to promote the Church.

Step 10: Follow-up and Win a Soul – Every contact with a donor is a "touch point" to build a connection. Use these connections to follow up and invite to special church activities. Overseers are asked to use these connections to grow their State/Region. Pastors can use these connections to grow your local church!

On the evangelism front, our General Evangelism Co-ordinator is asking the Church worldwide to conduct a Revival meeting for 11th to 13th April 2025. I will liaise with the Pastors to arrange this.

Message - Stay Awake

My message today stems from the Convention theme. Right now, we are approaching the midnight hour. It is a time where people are tired and exhausted after a day's activity. The natural tendency is to go to sleep, but if we go to sleep now, we may sleep the sleep of death and never wake up.

When people are asleep, they become vulnerable as they are not aware of what is going on around them. The apostle Paul was encouraging the saints in Thessalonica to be watchful and aware of the time that they were living in, over two thousand years ago.

The words of one song states:

Years of time have come and gone Since I first heard it told How Jesus would come again someday If back then it seemed so real Then I just can't help but feel How much closer His coming is today.

Signs of the times are everywhere There's a brand new feeling in the air Keep your eyes upon the eastern sky Lift up your head, redemption draweth nigh.

Wars and strife on every hand And violence fills the land Still some people doubt He'll ever come again But the Word of God is true He'll redeem His chosen few Don't lose hope, soon Christ Jesus will descend.

1"But of the times and the seasons, brethren, ye have no need that I write unto you. ²For yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so cometh as a thief in the night. ³For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape. ⁴But ye, brethren, are not in darkness, that that day should overtake you as a thief. ⁵Ye are all the children of light, and the children of the day: we are not of the night, nor of darkness." (1 Thessalonians 5:1-5)

Satan is forever trying to blow out our lights and leave us in darkness, but the words of a well-known song says: 'This little light of mine; I'm gonna let it shine... I won't let Satan blow it out.'

Paul then went on to say: "Therefore let us not sleep, as do others; but let us watch and be sober. (1 Thessalonians 5:6)

Sleep: (1) A periodic state of physiological rest during which consciousness is suspended and metabolic rate is decreased.

(2) Being in a dormant or inactive state.

Our theme Scripture admonishes us not to sleep as others, implying that others are asleep. The opposite of being asleep is to be awake.

Awake: (1) To emerge or rouse from sleep. (2) To become or cause to become alert

Sober: (1) Not affected by alcohol; not drunk. (2) Serious, sensible, and solemn.

People have various ways of staying awake. Some people drink coffee or other refreshments to stay awake. Another way to stay awake is to stay active and keep busy. It is said the devil finds work for idle hands. We need to be busy doing the Master's work or we will fall asleep. We need to be praying and reading our Bibles to keep awake, otherwise we will fall asleep.

Have you ever fallen asleep and been bitten by some insect like a mosquito? Sometimes, we only recognise that we have been bitten when we see and feel the effect sometime later. There are some parasites that bite their victims and deposit their eggs within them. These eggs germinate and then begin to eat the victim from within.

Some Christians have been bitten and impregnated with the seed of the enemy lying dormant within them. They fell asleep and woke up feeling strange, not knowing what had happened and after a while they dismissed the incident and carried on as normal. They look the same to the natural eye, but they have been impregnated with a virus which slowly takes its course.

They know when they fell and they know where they fell, but after a while they forget the bite and feel that they are ok. However, the seed has been planted, just awaiting the right time and conditions to germinate. After a while, we would not believe the behaviour of our once nice brother or sister. Their nature changed once that seed that was planted germinated.

²⁴"Another parable put he forth unto them, saying The kingdom of heaven is likened unto a man which sowed good seed in his field: ²⁵But while men slept, his enemy came and sowed tares among the wheat, and went his way. ²⁶But when the blades was sprung up, and brought forth fruit, then appeared the tares also. ²⁷So the servants of the householder came and said unto him, Sir, didst not thou sow good seed in the field? From whence then hath it tares? ²⁸He said unto them, An enemy hath done this. The servants said unto him, Wilt thou then that we go and gather them up? 29But he said, Nay; lest while ye gather up the tares, ye root up also the wheat with them. 30 Let both grow together until the harvest: and in the time of harvest I will say to the reapers, Gather ye together first the tares, and bind them in bundles to burn them: but gather the wheat into my barn." (St. Matthew 13:24-30)

When I was younger, I remember watching films about Dracula. Once he bit a victim, they were no longer the same again - even though they looked the same.

One of the most dangerous enemies to a Christian is a fallen brother or sister. The danger lies in the fact that we do not think they will harm us, so we are not on our guard. What we need to understand is that they have a new master. We should be especially careful of backslidden family members.

When people fail God, they often cover up what has happened to them and go on as normal, because of embarrassment. As a child growing up in Jamaica, I managed to get a Star Apple seed stuck in my nose. Because I did not tell anyone about it straight away, after some time I became embarrassed and afraid to talk about it. Luckily, my Aunt found out and managed to get it out. Had she not spotted that something was wrong that seed could have been detrimental to my physical health.

Some people feel that time heals sin, and if it is left long enough, God will overlook it, especially if they have done some good work as compensation. Some people when they do wrong will not say sorry. They will just do works to show you that they are sorry. However, if we commit sin, God wants us to confess it and forsake it. Until we can acknowledge where we fell or that we are at fault we cannot be helped. Sins unconfessed are sins un-forgiven. Time does not heal sin.

If we refuse to get right with God, which may mean doing our first works again, we will not be able to abide in His house, The Church of God. David, the Psalmist wrote: "1LORD, who shall abide in thy tabernacle? who shall dwell in thy holy hill? ²He that uprightly, and walketh worketh righteousness, and speaketh the truth in his heart. ³He that backbiteth not with his tongue, nor doeth evil to his neighbour, nor taketh up a reproach against his neighbour. ⁴In whose eyes a vile person is contemned; but he honoureth them that fear the LORD. He that sweareth to his own hurt, and changeth not. 5He that putteth not out his money to usury, nor taketh reward against the innocent. He that doeth these things *shall never be moved.*" (Psalm 15:1-5)

Brethren, let us walk in the light and let us stay awake.

The new general Assembly Band Movement theme for the assembly year 2024-2025 is:

'We are members of His Body'

(Ephesians 5:30)



Greetings to our Chronicle readers from the National ABM department of The Church of God in England. Our new ABM theme is a mysterious statement which would probably appear "foolishness" to the "natural man" (1 Corinthians 2:14), but for those able to spiritually discern its meaning, it brings with it a glorious revelation: "For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones. For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, and shall be joined unto his wife, and they two shall be one flesh. This is

a great mystery: but I speak concerning Christ and the church" (Ephesians 5:30-32).

One flesh as a concept is also mysterious. A husband and wife grew in separate wombs. It's beyond natural understanding that one flesh can be made out of two people. How can what appear in the natural eyes to be multiple pieces, in the spiritual realm, in actual fact be one?

"His Body", the Body of Christ, is the Church. From before the foundation of the world, as individual members we were chosen in Him "before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before him in love" (Ephesians 1:4). Each one of us has been set, or placed, in the body "as it hath pleased him." (1 Corinthians 12:18). "...the body is not one member, but many."

(1 Corinthians 12:14) and as Paul explains, body parts cannot tell themselves - or each other, that they are not needed. The Head of the Church is well able to make that call without our input, and if you are a member of His Body, you can be sure that He has a divine purpose for you. Whether you be the hand, foot, eyelash or little toe - you are a valued part of His Body and the ABM department is here to help maintain your spiritual health.

When Christ prayed "That they all may be one; as thou, Father, art in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us..." (St. John 17:21), I wonder whether He looked into the future and saw the members of His Body disputing like the body parts in 1 Corinthians 12? The oneness He prayed for has a divine purpose: "...that the world may believe that thou (the Father) hast sent me (Christ)". The Body functioning as one; with one mind, one faith and in one accord, will be a witness to the world that Jesus was sent by God and we can be certain that Christ's prayer will be fulfilled.

A quotation from a hymnal favourite goes like this: "We are not divided, all one body we. One in hope and doctrine, one in Charity". This depicts the Body of Christ in its perfect state. The bigger picture and future for the Body of Christ is that He will "present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing" (Ephesians 5:27).

In closing, here is an excerpt from M. A. Tomlinson's book, 'This Bible as the Word of God' that was printed in a recent Evening Light: "As members of the Church, the body of Christ, we have higher goals than unrestrained liberties and selfish ambitions. There can be no unified body with individual members thinking and acting differently, strictly as individuals. But O, the beauty of such attributes as grace-love-humility-submission-subjection-obedience!"









Acts 9:1-20 tells us that Saul (who later became Paul) had an encounter with Jesus. Before his encounter, he persecuted and 'wasted' the Church, having authority and a letter from the high priest. This caused him to throw men and women into prison.

As he was on his way to Damascus to persecute the Christians, he was struck down by a bright light that blinded him. Jesus spoke to him, "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?" "And he said, Who art thou, Lord? And the Lord said, "I am Jesus whom thou persecutest: it is hard for thee to kick against the pricks."

His encounter led him to prayer. Paul had a new direction. Instead of persecuting the people of God, he encouraged them to fight the good fight of faith. Paul had a life changing encounter with God. You cannot have an altar encounter with God and remain the same. No, there must be a change.

The continuing general Women's Missionary Band theme for the assembly year 2024-2025 is:

'Unstoppable!'

(St. Mark 16:15)



Our General theme is now in its second year but it is quite appropriate for the time that we now live in. It means we must keep working - no time to sleep, no time to play, no time to relax spiritually. There is no time to compromise. 'Sleep' here means being spiritually unconscious of the time we are living in.

We must be unstoppable in all we do and that includes redeeming the time. Paul told the Hebrew brethren that as they saw the day approaching, they were to exhort one another ('exhort' - strongly encourage or urge someone to do something). He was saying, encourage each other to be unstoppable (Hebrews 10:25). We must be in contact with and around each other, in order to exhort and encourage.

In the secular workplace there are policies and procedures, codes of conduct and ethics that must be adhered to. In the world, the entire legal system hinges on the 10 commandments, (well it used to). Many things have changed in the world today but in the spiritual realm nothing has changed.

I heard a message not long ago entitled, "Has God changed?" The preacher was comparing us to the stiff-necked Israelites, as the Scripture states. The conclusion was, we may believe that God has changed, simply because Christ stands between us and God interceding for our souls. Due to this, judgement is not executed swiftly - making it appear to many that God has changed.

The preacher went on to state: "wasn't Christ there interceding when Ananias and Sapphira dropped dead because of lying to the Holy Ghost?" Ananias and Sapphira forgot what God had told Moses when he said "...Ye are a stiffnecked people: I will come up into the midst of thee in a moment, and consume thee:..." (Exodus 33:5)

St. Matthew 5:19-20 is part of the sermon Jesus preach on the mount:

"Whosoever therefore shall break one of these least commandments, and shall teach men so, he shall be called the least in the kingdom of heaven: but whosoever shall do and teach them, the same shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.

²⁰ For I say unto you, That except your righteousness shall exceed the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, ye shall in no case enter into the kingdom of heaven."

The Scribes and Pharisees - had an outward appearance of righteousness, but inwardly they were whited sepulchres, living off the praises of men.

The commandments are like an unbroken chain - Unstoppable.

We must be unstoppable in keeping our doctrine and advice to members intact. We must be unstoppable in training up our children to keep this link unbroken. God bless us as we continue to be unstoppable in His service.

given to the congregation to be mindful of the commission that Jesus left and 'GO' tell someone about Jesus.




Sister Claudine Brown preached on the forgiveness of Christ and how we all must get to a place of forgiveness for God to work in His Church.

The Overseer, Bishop Bennett preached a message based on Revelation 19:7, titled 'The Perfecting Process Continues'. He


said the Church needs to be perfect. The Church has heard many admonishing messages from God urging us to take heed so we will be ready for His return.

National Overseer's Address - 'Stay Awake' - 1 Thessalonians 5:6

The Scripture admonishes '...let us not sleep, as do others...' as we must be alert for Jesus' return. The Scripture also tells us that His coming will be like that of a thief. We will not know the day, or the hour, so we as Christians need to be alert and sober.

One way of staying awake is to be active and busy. For Christians to stay awake spiritually, we must be actively reading our Bibles and praying. When someone is asleep, they are unaware of what is happening around them - especially if one is a heavy sleeper.

It is possible to be bitten during our sleep by mosquitoes or other parasites at night. We would be unaware of this, until a mark or swelling is seen the following morning. If left untreated, the area can become infected. Brother Bennett said that spiritually, some Christians have been bitten and instead of treating the area, they ignore it. The infection then germinates and sooner or later the effect of the bite is manifested in the person. They are no longer the same. In St. Matthew 13, Jesus spoke about the parable of the wheat and tares. The purpose of this is to warn us to be spiritually alert.

In closing, Brother Bennett said 'one of the most dangerous enemies to a Christian is a fallen brother or sister'. If we fall spiritually, we cannot ignore this or cover it up. We must acknowledge the wrong and seek forgiveness from God. 'Sins unconfessed are sins unforgiven'. Psalm 15:1-2: 'Lord, who shall abide in thy tabernacle?...He that walketh uprightly, and worketh righteousness, and speaketh the truth in his heart.'

Message by Sister Claudine Brown - 'But he that shall endure unto the end, the same shall be saved.' (St. Matthew 24:13)

Jesus Himself encouraged us to endure unto the end. The definition of endure is 'the ability to suffer a difficult process or situation without giving way'. Sister Claudine said: 'No one can endure on your behalf. When we are living for Christ, we must consider the cost (St. Luke 14:28-30). This means being ready to deny self and suffer loss for Christ. No one finishes a race the way they started it. A distance race requires endurance and stamina. We receive the ability to endure from the Lord when we spent time training in prayer on our knees.'

Cares and Affairs – St. Luke 8:14; St. Luke 21:34, these are the things that can blind us to the signs Jesus was warning us of in St. Matthew 24. Endurance comes from a deep-knitted relationship with the Lord. To learn how to endure, we have to learn how to pray.

Sister Claudine shared an example of endurance by explaining part of the US Combat Fitness Test. Two significant points used to assess fitness to join the army are to:

- i) reduce preventable injuries and attrition.
- ii) enhance mental toughness and stamina.

Sister Claudine said that sometimes the injuries we sustain could be avoided, for example, King David could have avoided the sin he committed with Bethsheba if he went to battle. We as humans have lost mental strength and toughness and have become brittle. We get offended easily and are quick to give up and walk away from the Church and Christ.

We need to have the mental toughness of our elders, who through many of life's trials endured. We must remember the apostle Paul's testimony in 2 Corinthians 11:23-28. He endured many afflictions. We cannot act like the world. We need Paul's resilience and mental stamina to make it and remain saved. Amen.








What's happening at Long Lane Church?

God continues to show us how He can make much out of little, for His glory. We experienced this during




